## About Golden Link Folk Singing Society

On a Tuesday in May 1971, several inspired folks decided to form a folk music club, patterned after the *Golden Ring: A Gathering of Friends for Making Music* album. That summer a picnic was held, with surprise guests John Roberts and Tony Barrand, Ithaca folksingers, and thus our festival tradition began.

The heart of Golden Link Folk Singing Society is the Tuesday evening sing-around, free and open to the public, where 30 or so people gather to share songs. The level of talent is not important; the love of music is what has held us together for more than 48 years. Bring a song and your acoustic instrument to Room 26 of 12 Corners Presbyterian Church, 1200 South Winton Road. Meetings run from 7:30 to 10:00 pm.

In addition to our festival, we hold concerts with touring musicians monthly, October to May. Over the decades we have presented well-known musicians such as Judy Collins, Tom, Paxton, Odetta, Robin and Linda Williams, and Tom Rush, but also have presented lesser-known names like Windborne, Ana Egge, and Matthew Byrne. Our concerts are held at Rochester Christian Reformed Church, 2750 Atlantic Ave. This season's series is shown on the back cover of the program.

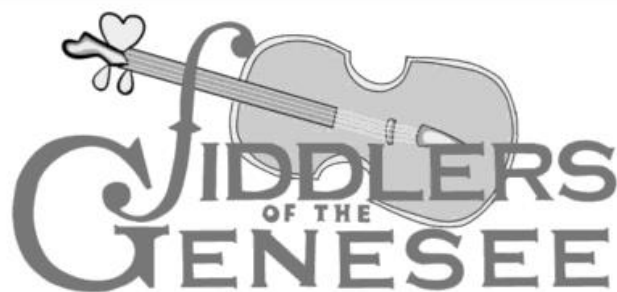

### Debra Cowan

“Stunning” is a word that is often used to describe Debra Cowan's vocals. She performs unaccompanied or with guitar, interpreting a wide range of traditional and contemporary folk songs. Debra's performances impress listeners with her clarity, warmth, agility, all the while encouraging the audience to join in on choruses

and refrains. Her five recordings have been met with high praise worldwide and in June 2015, she was featured in the UK folk music magazine, *Living Tradition*. She tours extensively in the United Kingdom and in North America and can also be seen on stage with her good friend, musician John Roberts.



### Annie & The Hedonists

This fun four-piece Albany-based band is known for its great lead singer, Annie Rosen, and the tight harmonies and superb musicianship of the Hedonists, a.k.a. Jonny Rosen (guitar and vocals), Peter Davis (clarinet, tenor guitar, piano, and vocals), and Don Young (upright bass, ukulele, and vocals). The band interprets

the songs of the great female blues artists of the 1920s, 30s, and 40s, as well as western swing, bluesy country, and roots Americana.



### Jay Ungar & Molly Mason

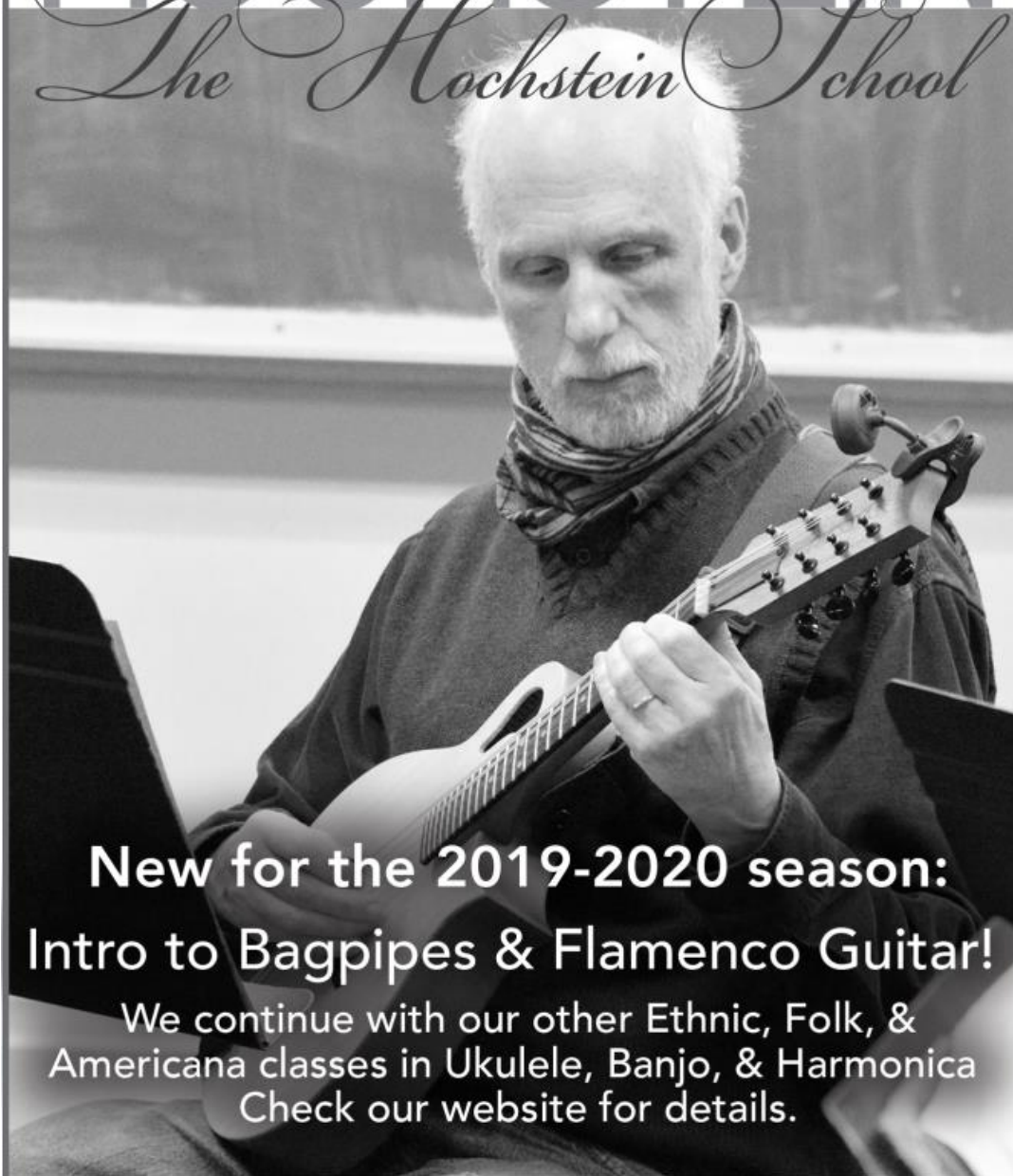
These extraordinary musicians won international acclaim after Ken Burns' documentary “The Civil War” hit the airwaves. Their performance of Jay's haunting composition “Ashokan Farewell,” which became the musical hallmark of the PBS series, left a lasting impression on everyone who tuned

in. Jay & Molly are masters of music and storytelling who generously share their lives and their music with audiences. Jay's fiddling is brimming with playfulness, drama, soulfulness, and technical verve. Molly's total mastery and inventiveness on piano and guitar is always spot-on, as she supports the tunes and follows the flow of the melody. Her rich and expressive vocals, along with the resonant strains of Jay's violin, reveal deep emotions. The duo have hosted programs at the Ashokan Music & Dance Camps since 1980.

### Heather Pierson Acoustic Trio

Heather Pierson is an award-winning multi-instrumentalist, singer/songwriter, and performer. From New Orleans-style jazz and blues to rousing Americana and poignant folk narratives, Heather moves seamlessly and effortlessly from one style to the next in her live performances, both solo and with her acoustic

trio of Davy Sturtevant on strings/cornet and Shawn Nadeau on bass. A growing catalog of wildly divergent CD releases reflects her boundless creativity. She is best known for her virtuosity at the piano, her bell-tone vocals, and her quiet yet engaging stage presence.



### Scott Cook

A roots balladeer with a rare personal warmth, Canada's Scott Cook has managed to distill the stories collected over 11 years touring across Canada, the US, Europe, Asia, Australia, and elsewhere into straight-talking, keenly observant verse. His songs weave threads of folk, roots, blues, soul, and country over spacious

fingerstyle guitar and clawhammer banjo arrangements. His fourth release, *One More Time Around*, was nominated for a Canadian Folk Music Award.



### Richie & Rosie

Richie Stearns is a legendary banjo player and singer, and a founding member of the neo-traditional alternative band The Horse Flies and roots music band Donna the Buffalo. He also has performed with Natalie Merchant, Bela Fleck, Pete Seeger, David Byrne, Billy Bragg & Wilco, Old Crow Medicine Show, and Joan Baez

– and he is the president of the annual GrassRoots Festival of Music & Dance. Rosie Newton is a talented fiddler and singer who graduated from Ithaca College with a degree in viola performance and has become an integral part of the Ithaca old-time music community. She has performed with The Duhks, Louisiana legend Preston Frank, Evil City String Band, Home Remedy, and The Pearly Snaps. Richie & Rosie collaborated in various projects over the past few years – including two CDs – creating a scintillating blend of traditional and original songs.

## Selected Workshop Descriptions

### **Old Time Fiddle Technique** – *Rosie Newton*

We will focus on learning tunes by ear. We will talk about bowing and rhythms typically found in this kind of music. We may have time to explore some cross-tunings.

### **Dis-Ease: A Coming Out** – *Davy Sturtevant*

In song, stories, and conversation, Davy will share his own story of “coming out” with a mental health diagnosis, living creatively and well. Scheduled for the Pavilion, to provide a bit of intimacy and to facilitate conversation.

### **Beginning Clawhammer Banjo** – *Richie Stearns*

Richie will discuss basic technique and teach tunes from his own unique style. He will also address how to best complement the fiddler, showing tunings and chord patterns to accompany both modern and traditional melodies.

### **The Eclectic Ukulele** – *Don Young*

Hawaiian ... Swing ... Banjo Uke ... George Formby – Don will enhance participants’ ukulele skills through experiencing the variety of styles the instrument affords.

### **Learning New Tunes by Ear** – *Jonny Rosen*

This workshop will help participants learn new tunes by recognizing chord progressions, note patterns, and other basic recognizable parts of music.

### **Heart Songs & Circle Songs** – *Heather Pierson*

This workshop will engage participants in “praxis:” learning and doing. We will learn some circle songs and heart songs, and practice the art of community singing.

### **Chord Family Secrets** – *Peter Davis*

Learn how chords go together. Common progressions in folk, ragtime, early jazz, country, and pop will be explained and practiced in the session.

The Raffle Guitar this year comes courtesy of Stutzman's Guitar Center. This very nice circa 1980 LoPrinzi guitar was made by Thomas LoPrinzi and features a Brazilian rosewood back and sides with a spruce top and ebony fingerboard, and Grover gears. 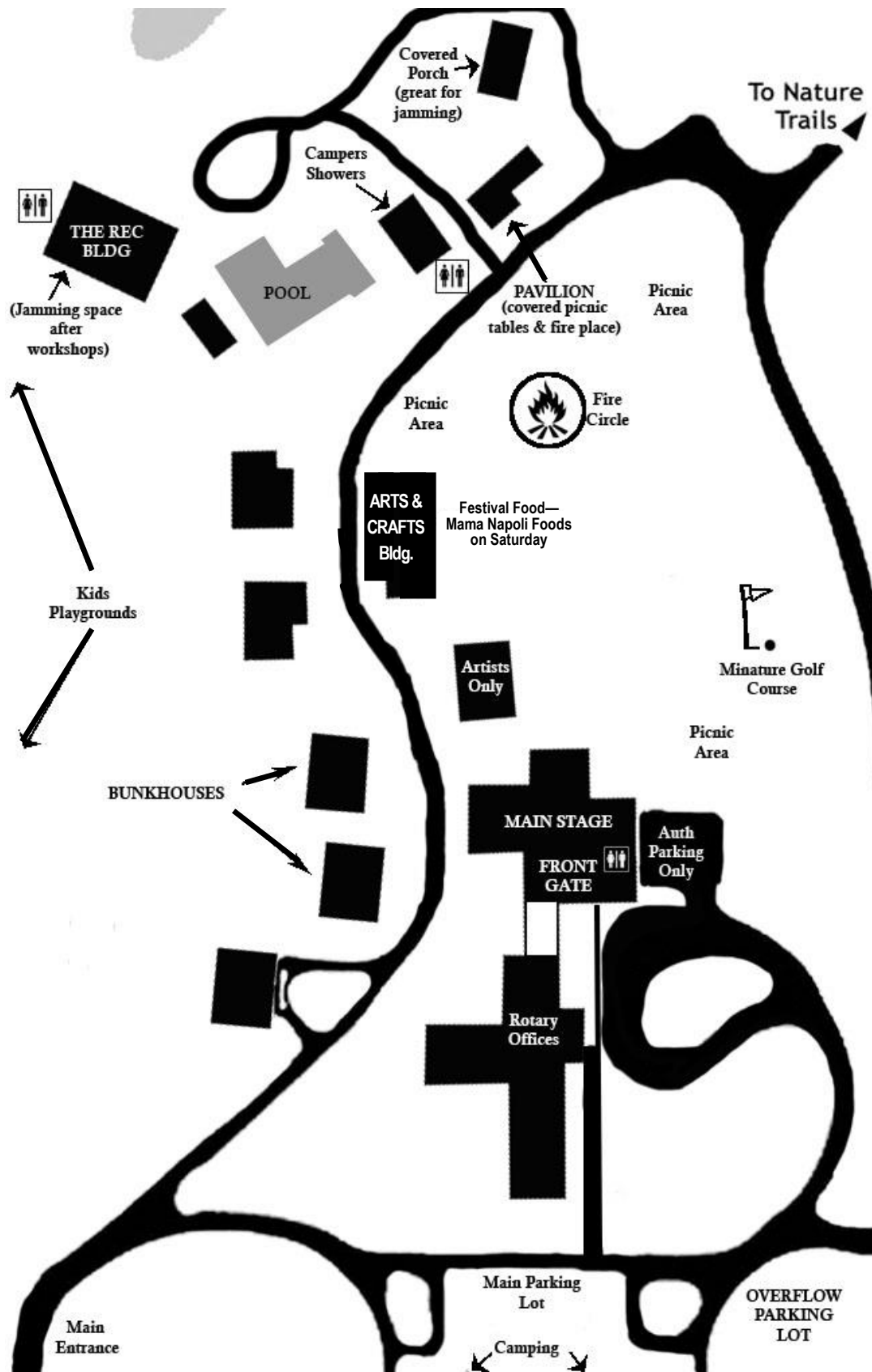
